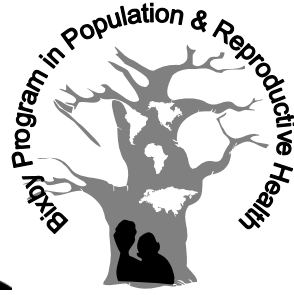

- a. Group ribbon-making activity to pass out during World AIDS day and lecture series

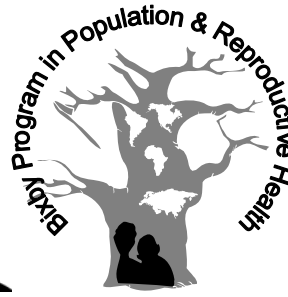
III. Committee Updates
